Purpose of the subject						

Strengthening the foundations of the Lithuanian language through traditional singing. Practical acquaintance with Lithuanian ethnic music, traditional music instruments, a lexicon of folk songs (dialects, onomatopoeic words), various forms of collective singing and ethnic choreography.

Short Abstract of the subject (up to 500 characters)

The practice of traditional singing is combined with several introductory theoretical lectures on Lithuanian ethnic music: songs, instruments and choreography. Listening skills: an acquaintance with regional characteristics of traditional singing.

Pronunciation skills: vowels, consonants, diphthongs consolidation through singing. Singing skills: singing songs and the *sutartinės*. Communicative skills: collective singing and playing on *skudučiai* as a means of communication and musical expression. Syncretic expression skills: a syncretic unity of singing and dancing.
