As part of the celebration of the 700th anniversary of Vilnius, the Martynas Mažvydas National Library of Lithuania invites researchers and practitioners to the international conference, *Europe. Capital. Transformations: Vilnius in the 19th-21st Centuries*, which will take place on **October 19-20, 2023** at the National Library of Lithuania, Vilnius.

Over the last 200 years, Vilnius has undergone major changes in its political status, social and demographic transformations: from a provincial city of the Russian Empire, to an administrative center under German occupation and provincial center of Poland, to the capital of independent and Soviet-occupied Lithuania and finally, to the capital of a EU member state. During this period, the composition of the Vilnius' population and its identities went through many changes, as did the social and cultural picture of the city.

The conference welcomes an interdisciplinary dialogue in order to explain the various transformations associated with Vilnius, their origins, current situation and future perspectives. To reveal the city's vitality, it proposes to look at Vilnius in the context of a dynamic and transformative process.

The conference is open to anthropologists, architects, demographers, dendrologists, ecological economists, philosophers, historians, language and communication studies researchers, literary scholars, art historians, heritage preservationists, political scientists, semioticians, sociologists, urbanists, and other researchers and scientists.

- Vilnius and other cities
- The urban and architectural development of Vilnius
