REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SECOND CYCLE (MASTER'S) STUDIES ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

MUSIC PERFORMANCE (SPECIALISATION - CHOIR CONDUCTING)

Admission to the second-cycle studies in Choir Conducting within the Music Performance programme is open to individuals who have completed first-cycle (Bachelor's) studies in the field of music.

If the applicant has completed first-cycle studies in a field other than music, they must provide documents (such as a professional portfolio) during the admission interview, proving at least one year of professional experience.

The admission score (the maximum value of which is 10) consists of the following:

- the evaluation of the entrance examination (conducting) has a weighted coefficient of 0.6;
- the evaluation of the admission interview based on questions related to the chosen study programme has a weighted coefficient of 0.2;
- the average score of the grades obtained during the first cycle studies (grades specified in the Diploma Supplement) has a weighted factor of 0.2.

Applicants who have completed the first-cycle studies in Music Performance programme Choir Conducting specialisation at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre in 2025 do not have to take the entrance exam (conducting). The calculation of their admission score includes the evaluation of the bachelor's thesis (the final art project in Conducting).

Individuals who have completed the first cycle studies at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre prior to 2025 as well as graduates of the first cycle studies at other Lithuanian or foreign higher education institutions must take the entrance examination.

The admission interview based on questions related to the chosen study programme is mandatory for all applicants.

1. The entrance examination (conducting)

The applicants will have to perform (conduct) three pieces on the piano to the accompaniment:

- two pieces *a cappella* belonging to different epochs and styles;
- a large-scale piece (or its movements) with an accompaniment.
- 1. perform the score of the *a cappella* pieces from memory on the piano; perform the scores of other choral works and the accompaniment on the piano by sight-reading;
- 2. be able to analyse the scores of the pieces performed.

The duration of the programme is 15-20 min

2. The interview based on questions related to the chosen study programme.

The admission interview aims at:

- evaluating the applicant's knowledge and abilities in the chosen field of studies; his/ her desire to develop as a professional; his/her expectations of studies and professional aspirations;
- The topics of the admission interview:
 - Renaissance choral music;
 - Baroque choral music;
 - choral music by Vienna's classical composers;
 - choral music of Early Romanticism;
 - the second half of the 19th century: choral music of Late Romanticism;
 - choral music of the first half of the 20th century;
 - choral music of the second half of the 20th century;
 - Lithuanian choral music until 1940s;
 - Lithuanian choral music of the second half of the 20th century;
 - traditions of Lithuanian song festivals and their development prospects in Lithuania;
 - types and kinds of choirs;
 - the structure of the voice box;
 - a choir ensemble and intonation;
 - choral voices and their characteristics;
 - the key primary methodological principles of teaching conducting (teaching methods);
 - auftakts (upbeats) and conducting schemes;
 - the historiographic review of conducting as a performing arts;
 - development of performing skills of a conductor;
 - ways of developing the sense of rhythm.
- discussion of the professional portfolio (if applicable).
