

# **LITHUANIAN ACADEMY OF MUSIC AND THEATRE REGULATIONS FOR STUDENT ADMISSION IN 2026**

## **REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION OF APPLICANTS HOLDING QUALIFICATIONS FROM A FOREIGN INSTITUTION OR AN INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATION TO THE LITHUANIAN ACADEMY OF MUSIC AND THEATRE**

### **I. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

1. The admission of applicants holding qualifications from a foreign institution or an international organisation (hereinafter referred to as "Foreign Institutions") to study at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre (hereinafter referred to as "the Academy") shall be conducted in accordance with these Regulations and Order No. V-932 by the Minister of Education, Science and Sport of the Republic of Lithuania *On the approval of the description of the procedures for the competition of foreign qualification holders to the state-funded study places* of June 19, 2020.

2. Applicants holding qualifications from Foreign Institutions are admitted to the Academy on the basis of competition to study in the State-funded places and the places not funded by the State.

3. Applicants holding qualifications from Foreign Institutions who are applying for the Academy's first cycle (bachelor's) and second cycle (master's) study programmes are admitted on a competition basis to the State-funded places with the condition they are:

3.1. citizens of the Republic of Lithuania, other European Union Member States or the States of the European Economic Area and their family members;

3.2. citizens of countries that do not belong to the European Union and European Economic Area and have a permanent residence permit in the Republic of Lithuania, and stateless persons;

3.3. foreign Lithuanians.

4. Foreign citizens and stateless persons (hereinafter referred to as "Foreigners") who do not meet the criteria outlined in Paragraph 3 of these Regulations shall be admitted to the Academy on a competition basis to study at the Academy at their own expense, unless otherwise provided by international agreements or other legal acts.

5. Applicants holding qualifications from Foreign Institutions who seek to enter the Academy shall provide a document recognising the applicant's prior education for the purpose of further studies in Lithuania. To obtain this recognition, must submit an application form and scanned copies of documents within the deadlines specified on the website of the Academy.

6. Upon admission to the Academy, Foreigners must obtain a temporary residence permit in the Republic of Lithuania, or a residence permit of a citizen of a Member State of the European Community or have a permanent residence permit in the Republic of Lithuania.

7. The admission of applicants holding qualifications from Foreign Institutions to the first (bachelor's) and second cycle (master's) study programmes is conducted by the work group of the Academy's Admissions team.

## II. STUDY PROGRAMMES

8. At the Academy, Foreigners may follow the study programmes conducted in the Lithuanian or English.

9. Foreigners who seek to study in the Lithuanian language must have knowledge of the Lithuanian language. The required level of proficiency in the Lithuanian language for individuals enrolled in the Academy's study programmes conducted in the Lithuanian language is defined by Order No. V-932 by the Minister of Education, Science and Sport of the Republic of Lithuania *On the approval of the description of the procedures for the competition of foreign qualification holders to the state-funded study places* of June 19, 2020.

10. Foreign applicants intending to study in programmes delivered in English must submit certificates issued by an official institution confirming their English language proficiency (*TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge English, LanguageCert or Duolingo English Test*). The required level of English must be no lower than B1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

11. The study programmes conducted in the Lithuanian language and open for admission are specified in the Academy's Regulations for Student Admission in 2026.

12. The admission is open to the following **first cycle (bachelor's)** programmes that are taught in the English language:

12.1. **Music Performance** (all specialisations with the exception of Folk Instruments);

12.2. **Music studies** (Composition, Electronic Music, Music and Education);

12.3. **Dance and Education;**

13. The admission is open to the following **second cycle (master's)** study programmes conducted in the English language:

13.1. **Music Performance** (all specialisations with the exception of Folk Instruments);

13.2. **Composition** (Academic Creation, Digital Technologies);

14. Foreigners are admitted to the above-mentioned study programmes with the condition that they have an appropriate level of education and have passed the entrance examinations.

## III. TUITION FEES

15. The tuition fees for Foreigners who have been admitted to the places that are not funded by the State shall be determined and approved by the Senate of the Academy.

16. The annual tuition fee for Foreigners admitted to the places that are not funded by the State shall be approved no later than March 1, 2026, in accordance with the legislation in force.

## IV. ADMISSION STAGES

17. Admission to the first (bachelor's) and second cycle (master's) study programmes is conducted on a competition basis following the stages defined below:

### Stage One

18. Applicants intending to enroll in the study programs offered by the Academy are recommended to submit the following documents to the Academy's Admissions Committee via email by April 1, 2026

18.1. A completed application form (the form is available at [www.lmta.lt](http://www.lmta.lt));

18.2. An online link to a video/audio recording.

## Stage Two

19. After the Department has assessed the Foreigner's compliance with the Academy's requirements for admission into a selected study programme and the Foreigner's ability to take the entrance examinations, the work group of the Academy's Admissions Office no later than 1 May, 2026 shall inform the applicant by e-mail regarding the invitation to take the entrance examinations remotely, specifying the time and place of the entrance examinations.

20. The requirements for and schedule of the entrance examinations are announced on the Academy's website [www.lmta.lt](http://www.lmta.lt).

21. Applicants seeking to enter the first cycle studies at the Academy shall follow the approved centralised admission procedure conducted by the Lithuanian Higher Education Association for Centralised Admission (hereinafter referred to as "LAMA BPO") in compliance with the approved regulations for the centralised admission. Information on the regulations for the centralised admission, admission procedures and deadlines is announced on LAMA BPO website [www.lamabpo.lt](http://www.lamabpo.lt).

22. Applicants seeking to enter the second cycle studies are admitted according to the regulations set by the Academy. The applicants must provide the following documents in the electronic format:

<b>No later than 24 hours prior to the start of the entrance examination:</b>
copies of documents confirming the applicant's education (no need to submit documents if you graduated from LMTA in 2019 – 2026)
certified true copies of documents confirming the applicant's education (where the applicant holds secondary qualifications at Foreign Institutions and the documents have not been issued in English)
a certificate verifying the level of the language (Lithuanian/ English) in which the Foreigner seeks to study (where the corresponding language is not their mother tongue)
proof of name change (where the submitted documents contain different names or last names of the applicant)
a copy of the receipt of the paid enrolment fee
a certificate on the obtained credits and the nature of their funding (where the applicant has studied at the same study cycle at another higher education institution in Lithuania)
<b>Prior to signing the Study Agreement:</b>
The decision of the Centre for Quality Assessment in Higher Education regarding the academic recognition of a foreign qualification, if the recognition has been carried out by an institution other than LMTA.

## V. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

23. The admission and enrolment in the first cycle (bachelor's) and second cycle (master's) study programmes at the Academy is only open for the Foreigners who have passed the entrance examinations.

24. The composition of the admission score and the percentage of its components **for the first cycle (bachelor's) study programmes in the fields of Music** is the following:

24.1. evaluation of the entrance examination —100 %;

25. The composition of the admission score and the percentage of its components **for the second cycle (master's) study programmes in the field of Music (except for the specialisations of Music Performance, Chamber Ensemble and Music Performance, Accompaniment)** is the following:

25.1. the evaluation of the entrance examination— 60 %;

25.2. evaluation of the admission interview based on questions related to the chosen study programme —20%;

25.3. the average score of the grades specified in the bachelor's Diploma Supplement (transcript of records) — 20%.

26. The composition of the admission score and the percentage of its components **for the second cycle (master's) study programmes in the field of Music for the specialisations of *Music Performance, Chamber Ensemble and Music Performance, Accompaniment*** is the following:

26.1. the evaluation of Chamber Ensemble or Accompaniment entrance examination (depending on the selected specialization) — 30%;

26.2. the evaluation of Music Performance entrance examination — 30 %;

26.3. the evaluation of the admission interview based on questions related to the chosen study programme — 20%;

26.4. the average score of the grades specified in the bachelor's Diploma Supplement (transcript of records) — 20%.

27. Within every study programme, the applicants are ranked in descending order according to their admission score.

## **VI. DOCUMENTATION OF ADMISSION OF APPLICANTS WHO HAVE BEEN INVITED TO STUDY**

28. The Academy and the applicants who have been invited to study shall conclude electronic Study Agreements. Where there is no possibility to sign the Study Agreement electronically, it will be made possible for the applicant or their attorney to arrive and conclude the Agreement in person. In case the applicant who has been invited to study fails to sign the Agreement with the Academy according to the set regulations, the invitation to study at the Academy shall be cancelled. The lists of the enrolled applicants are approved by orders by the Rector of the Academy.

29. On documenting the admission, the Foreigners who have been invited at the first cycle (bachelor's) of studies must submit the following documents to the Academy's Admissions team electronically in the LMTA study system:

a certificate verifying the level of the language (Lithuanian/ English) in which the Foreigner seeks to study (where the corresponding language is not their mother tongue)
proof of name change (where the submitted documents contain different names or last names of the applicant)
A copy of the receipt for the paid enrolment fee
A copy of the receipt for the paid tuition fee for Semester One (where the admitted person's studies are not financed by state)
A document stating the gained academic credits and their way of financing (where the admitted person has studied at other Lithuanian higher education institutions in the same study cycle)

30. On documenting the admission, the Foreigners who have been invited at the first cycle (bachelor's) of studies must submit the following documents to the Academy's Admissions team electronically in the LMTA study system:

A copy of the receipt for the paid tuition fee for Semester One (where the admitted person's studies are not financed by state)
ID card or passport (to be shown if the contract is not signed electronically)

## **VII. FINAL PROVISIONS**

32. If documents are not submitted in time or are incomplete, requests for admission are not considered.
33. Studies in the English language shall be conducted providing that there are at least 5 (three) Foreigners admitted to the study programme.
34. If the number of foreigners enrolled in a study programme is less than 5 (five), and in all other cases not provided for in these Regulations, the decisions shall be made by a Commission established by order of the Rector of the LMTA.
